Making Over Main Street



The City of North Bay is embarking on an exciting project to makeover and update our Main Street. The revitalization project benefits from over \$600,000 in funding support from the **Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation NOHFC**.


The project will include elements such as concrete accents, new furnishings, festoon lighting, signage, and foliage that will create an enhanced pedestrian experience and contribute to retail vibrancy.

The Making Over Main Street project is currently underway and will involve the reconstruction of Main Street from Sherbrooke Street to Cassells Street, and Ferguson Street, from Main Street to Oak Street.

Each block is expected to take up to three months to complete. Only once a block has been fully reconstructed will the contractor proceed to the next block. See the map below for a visual construction timeline.

Community Celebrates Armed Forces Day



North Bay continues to play an integral part in national defence with over 500 military personnel calling North Bay home. <u>22 Wing/Canadian Forces</u> <u>Base North Bay (CFB North Bay)</u> is one of the most important military bases in Canada with respect to the continental air defence of North America and will be celebrating 100 years in 2024.

For over 70 years, North Bay's air force base has been working in collaboration with the U.S. through **NORAD** for the air defence of the Canada-US portion of the North American continent. North Bay also plays a vital role in aerospace defence operations through the monitoring of Sapphire, Canada's first military satellite.

On **Wednesday**, **June 7th**, the North Bay community will gather and celebrate its <u>annual Armed Forces Day</u>. This day-long event is an opportunity for the community to show appreciation for all individuals who have and still are proudly serving in the Canadian Armed Forces. This will be the 11th year of celebrations with the theme being Agile, Integrated, and Inclusive.

Thousands of people participated in the event by interacting with military personnel and their informative static displays and watching the CF-18 Tactical Demonstration Team and the Canadian Armed Forces Sky Hawks Parachute Team in action!

In North Bay, we pride ourselves on hosting a variety of family-friendly events that showcase and celebrate our residents, local amenities, economic industries, and diverse cultures. Transportation and Defence, Our Past and Our Future



Transportation and defence are an important part of North Bay's history and future. Known as the "Gateway of the North", North Bay's strategic location at the crossroads of Highways 11, 63 and Trans Canada Highway 17 means easy access for people and goods moving in and out of northern Ontario.

One of the few communities in Canada that is home to 2 short line railways and a municipally owned airport with an industrial business park and a 10,000ft runway, North Bay is well positioned for cargo logistics. Adjacent to the <u>North Bay Jack Garland Airport (YYB)</u> is <u>22 Wing/Canadian Forces</u> <u>Base North Bay (CFB North Bay)</u> and <u>Nasittuq Corporation</u>, strategic partners in protecting Canada's sovereignty.

Industry leaders such as **Voyageur Aviation Corp.** continue to leverage North Bay's exceptional infrastructure to support their operations. Voyageur Aviation Corp. was recently awarded the In-Service-Support('ISS') contract for the Manned Airborne Intelligence Surveillance and Reconnaissance ('MAISR') program, in partnership with General Dynamics Mission Systems-Canada for the Canadian Armed Forces surveillance aircraft.

North Bay's **Economic Development Department** continues to work with our partners including **FedNor** to help advance opportunities for northern Ontario companies to participate in the defence sector and further diversify operations.
