

DEMOGRAPHICS

North Bay has a population of **52,662** with a regional trading area of approximately 112,000 people. The North Bay Census Agglomeration includes The City of North Bay, Municipality of East Ferris, Bonfield Township, Municipality of Callander, Chisholm Township, Nipissing Township, Nipissing Unorganized (North Part) and Municipality of Powassan, with a population of 71,736.

The growth trend experienced between 2011-2021 is expected to continue, with an increase of newcomers moving to the community.






Population Growth 2016 - 2021

North Bay has a median age of **44** years old.




LANGUAGES

WORKFORCE, TRAINING AND **EDUCATION**

North Bay's workforce is skilled, loyal, educated and creative. Absenteeism and turnover rates are relatively low and labour/management relations are excellent. To maintain and build on this workforce, industry and educational partnerships are commonly formed, and customized programs are established to find innovative solutions and meet specific industry needs.

According to Statistics Canada, the Census Profile 2021 stated that there are 25,425 individuals in the workforce in North Bay with a total of 39,405 individuals in the workforce in the Nipissing District.





EDUCATION

North Bay is home to Nipissing University and Canadore College, several private colleges, training institutions, vocational schools, and four school boards. With a wide range of educational institutions and programs, students have the opportunity to begin learning in junior kindergarten and complete their studies with a Ph.D..

The community is home to **four** school boards that provide educational opportunities in English and French as well as Public and Catholic settings.

TRAINING

North Bay is home to educational institutions and training facilities that support the local workforce. In addition to the post-secondary institutions mentioned, there are also several private training institutions, including:

Helicopters Canada Flight Training School An approved Transport Canada Flight Training School and Charter that offers a variety of programs in relation to helicopter licensing.

Transport Training Centres of Canada Offers programs for commercial truck drivers, heavy equipment operators and beginner drivers in Canada.

Through <u>Yes Employment Services</u>, employers can access available hiring and training incentives such as the <u>Canada-Ontario Job Grant</u> and assistance for <u>apprenticeship</u> programs.





HIRING

There are a variety of organizations ready to assist employers with their attracting, retaining and hiring processes. TRANSPORTATION

North Bay is well connected to major urban markets in Canada and the United States via a network of transportation options, including roads, air and rail. Centrally located, the community is also home to several international carriers and freight forwarding services.



Land

North Bay is serviced by public transportation, providing an efficient way to travel within city limits. Public transportation is fully accessible to all individuals. There are a number of taxi and rideshare companies that operate within the city and Ontario Northland provides reliable motor coach services.

Air

Just minutes from the downtown core, the municipally-owned North Bay Jack Garland Airport (YYB) boasts the longest runway in Northern Ontario. With a main runway of 10,000 ft. in length, Category 1 instrument landing system, Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) and flight service stations, YYB Airport attracts and accommodates aircrafts ranging in size from light trainers to widebodied "heavies" such as the Boeing 747 and Antonov 124.



Rail

High-capacity rail freight lines connect to major centres and make it possible to transfer heavy load, major volume materials quickly and efficiently. Canadian Pacific (CP) Railway, Canadian National (CN) Railway, and Ottawa Valley Railway (OVR) provide freight services to and from North Bay and are well-connected to the United States' rail system and to all industrial areas in Canada.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

The City of North Bay is committed to ensuring companies are well served during and after their expansion project or relocation to the community. The economic development team is available to assist with all aspects of business development, from access to capital, location review and site selection, to grand opening and community integration.

The team engages a network of community partners to help companies access services, resources and funding programs that support innovation, capital requirements and talent recruitment, settlement, and development. This ensures that new investors and their employees have access to the types of resources and professional services needed to thrive in the community.

Additionally, North Bay was one of the first municipalities in the province to institute a streamlined development approach called Development Application Review Team (DART).

The primary objective is to facilitate development by ensuring a coordinated and timely response on all development proposals. DART reviews all development applications and Site Plan Control Agreements to ensure that projects move forward quickly and adhere to project deadlines.

In collaboration with the Economic Development Department, The Business Centre provides information, programs, training and resources to entrepreneurs, start ups and expanding businesses in Nipissing and Parry Sound Districts.

North Bay helps companies leverage their investments through fully serviced municipal industrial parks, expedited permitting, no industrial development charges and a variety of municipal fees and tax rebate programs.

INCENTIVES

New and existing businesses located in North Bay may be eligible for financial government support. Federal and Provincial governments have a variety of funding programs in place for wage subsidies, research and development, and capital projects ranging from grants to incentive term loans, to minor equity instruments.

North Bay's municipal government has reduced industrial taxes by 66%, one of the lowest levels in Ontario, and has eliminated industrial development charges.

In order to help encourage development, North Bay City Council has approved a Growth Community Improvement Plan (GCIP). This program is designed to grow the community through city wide programming for industrial development and targeting intensification for housing and downtown waterfront commercial projects.

The Growth Community Improvement Plan, combined with competitive land values, easy commutes and an affordable lifestyle make North Bay an attractive location to grow your business and family.

IMMIGRATION & SETTLEMENT SUPPORT

North Bay has seen an increase in new Canadians relocating to the area. Settlement services offered through the North Bay & District Multicultural Centre provide resources and support to newcomers and members of the community. Programs and services ensure successful integration and retention of newcomers.

Additionally, North Bay is one of the eleven Canadian communities participating in the <u>Rural Northern Immigration Pilot</u> (RNIP) program. This federal program is a tool designed to assist our employers looking to hire an immigrant, temporary resident or overseas candidate that wants to become a permanent resident.

INDUSTRIAL

The City of North Bay has a supply of public and private industrial land available for development. Location options, including parcel size, combined with funding incentives allow for viable investment opportunities. In addition to the low industrial tax rate, North Bay provides added economic benefits for companies planning to locate or expand within the City.



COMMERCIAL

North Bay continues to see the development and expansion of a wide variety of chains and local specialty shops. The commercial base is well established in four primary nodes with a number of secondary nodes that have experienced strong and balanced growth. There are a variety of properties available for commercial and office ventures including mixed use and multi-tenant buildings.

UTILITIES

The City takes a conscientious approach to balance environmental stewardship with growth, and takes a leadership role with green initiatives such as the community energy park and the Merrick landfill gas utilization facility.

WATER AND SEWER

The City of North Bay has a **\$45 million** water treatment facility and recently invested in upgrades to the sewage treatment plant to ensure that future needs for services are met.

WASTE MANAGEMENT AND RECYCLING

Striving to reduce the City's ecological footprint, the City operates an integrated waste and recycling collection system. Curbside recycling, yard waste and garbage pickup are available to residents within city limits. Recycling depots are available within the city including the hazardous waste depot and electronic drop off facility. The City's Merrick Landfill is equipped with a methane collection system, currently generating **1.3 megawatts** of electricity.





NATURAL GAS

The City is serviced by Enbridge Gas Inc. which is a major Canadian natural gas storage, transmission and distribution company based in Ontario.

The distribution business serves about **1.4 million** residential, commercial and industrial customers in more than 400 communities across northern, southwestern and eastern Ontario. For current gas rates, please visit Enbridge Gas.


ELECTRICITY


HEALTH CARE

North Bay has a strong and innovative health care sector represented by organizations specializing in health sciences and patient care.

The <u>North Bay Regional Health Centre</u> (NBRHC) is a partnership involving the North Bay and District Hospital and the Northeast Mental Health Centre. The \$550 million hospital, totaling 720,000 sq. ft./ 66,890m² is situated on an 80-acre/32 hectare site on Highway 17 West.

The hospital services a population of more than 129,000, and includes a large emergency department with 32 treatment stretchers, and an ambulatory care centre. There are also a number of health and medical clinics throughout the city.





Nurse practitioner-led clinics offer a team-based approach to frontline health care. Nurse practitioners are able to treat common illnesses, injuries, and order lab tests, x-rays and other diagnostic tests.

In addition to family practitioner specialists, North Bay is serviced by dentists, orthodontists, periodontists, prosthodontists, optometrists, audiologists and midwives.

Furthermore, North Bay is home to the <u>One Kids Place</u> <u>Childrens' Treatment Centre</u>. This Centre provides community-based rehabilitation and related support services for children and youth (up to the age of 19) and their families living in the Districts of Muskoka, Nipissing and Parry Sound.

LIFESTYLE

With a **15-minute** work-to-home commute, affordable living, and natural beauty, including vast lakes, trail networks, and ski hill in the middle of the City, North Bay's quality of life is matched by its vibrant entrepreneurial ecosystem.





North Bay's waterfront, on Lake Nipissing, is the heartbeat of the City, featuring a magnificent walkway adorned by beautiful gardens, a museum and a public marina. With sandy beaches, walking paths, warm and shallow waters, ample fishing and boating opportunities, snowmobiling, picture perfect sunsets, and an endless variety of seasonal activities, the waterfront is the place to be.



Downtown

The downtown core is a vibrant area close to the waterfront and family-friendly outdoor amenities such as the splashpad, parks and walking trails. With numerous retail outlets, professional and personal services, restaurants and hotels, the downtown offers a range of unique products and services.



Arts, Culture & Heritage

Arts, culture, and heritage is deeply rooted in North Bay. With a selection of galleries, museums, historical buildings and a well-known 1,000 seat performance theatre, the creative sector is thriving throughout the community



Recreation

North Bay's natural environment features access to 3,400 km of groomed snowmobile trails, close proximity to 8 golf courses, 6 marinas, 43 beaches, 73 park areas and access to 100+ km of multi-use trails. Additional features within city limits include Duchesnay Falls, Laurentian Ski Hill and two large lakes with uninhibited vistas and vacant islands.
